**As a reminder of the email sent out on November 2nd regarding Conflicts of Interest, please take a moment to review:**

As we get closer to the start of the basketball season and the opening of the "self-assign" process, it's important that the CAO A cover some basic guidelines in regards to Conflicts of Interest.

Self-Assign is a privilege that is enjoyed by our membership. Like any other privilege, if abused it will go away. We had numerous examples last season of our officials inappropriately assigning themselves games.

Please follow the guidelines below from Mike Conlin, Coordinator of Officials, when deciding whether or not you have a "conflict of interest" that should preclude you from working a basketball game.

1. If you coach at and/or are employed by a school in any position, you cannot officiate at that school in any sport or level (Varsity, JV, Freshman).
2. If you have a relative who is coaching at that school at any level, you cannot officiate at that school.
3. If you have a child or relative playing any sport or level at a school, you cannot officiate at that school.
4. If you are involved in youth or recreational sports within a school district, you cannot officiate at that school.

**The overall philosophy behind "conflict of interest" is this: With as many games as there are to work, why put anyone in a jam over working a game that you shouldn't work?**
